Impact Staffing
<i>Additional Teacher Maths - £34,000</i> The significant investment in employing an additional, high quality teacher in Maths was of great benefit to those students eligible for Pupil Premium funding in 2020-21. Centre Assessed Grades demonstrate that this investment contributed towards 75% of pupil premium students achieving a grade 4-9 in Maths and 66.7% achieving a grade 4-9 in both Best English and Maths. This figure was higher than the 2019-20 percentage.

Inclusion Curriculum - £55,000

The significant investment in staffing in our inclusion area has enabled the provision of bespoke 1:1 or small group tuition. All vulnerable students who are eligible for Pupil Premium funding have benefitted from this provision which has contributed to significant improvement in Centre Assessed Grades.

<i>Employing the services of Every Day Counts (EDC) - £4,000</i> The £4,000 we have been able to invest in Every Day Counts (EDC) has been crucial in maintaining / improving the attendance of our students eligible for Pupil Premium funding. Of the 16 pupils eligible for Pupil Premium support, 13 had an attendance rate in excess of 95%. We believe that this played a major part in the following impressive outcomes for this group of students: Only 2 students out of the 16 Year 11 targeted students had an attendance rate of less than 85%.
