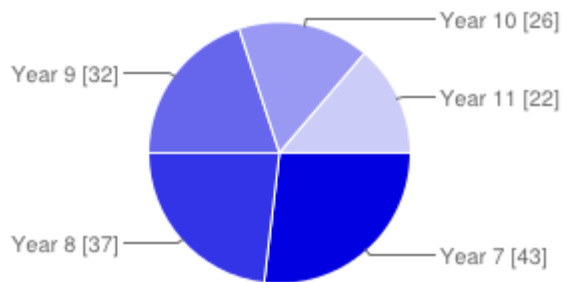


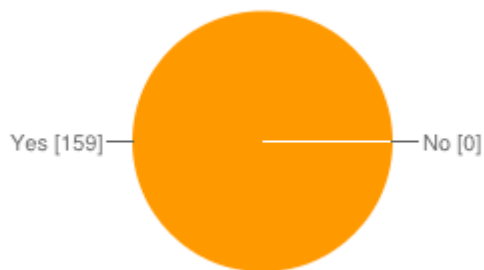

2. Does your son/daughter have access to the Internet at home?

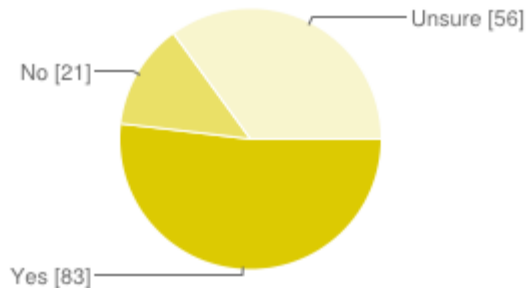

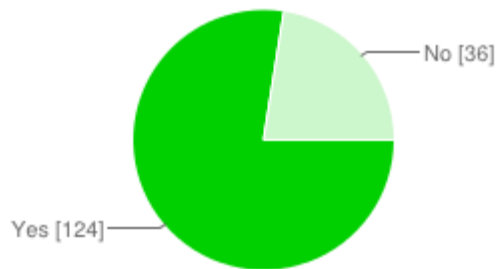

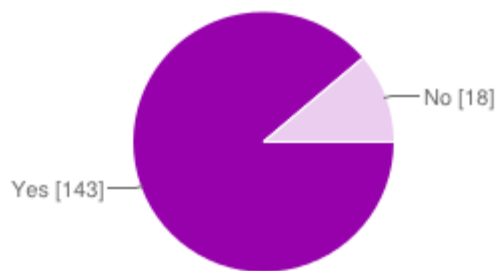

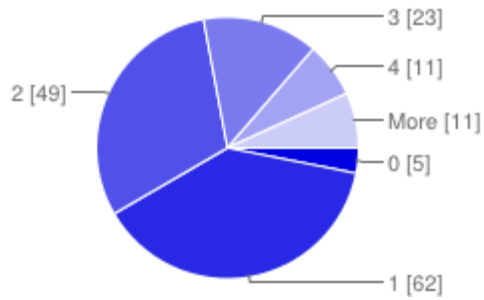

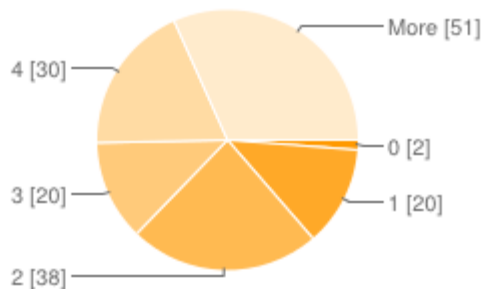

7. During the week, how long does your son/daughter spend on the Internet (in hours) each day?



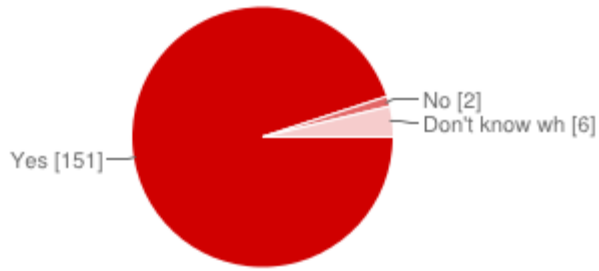

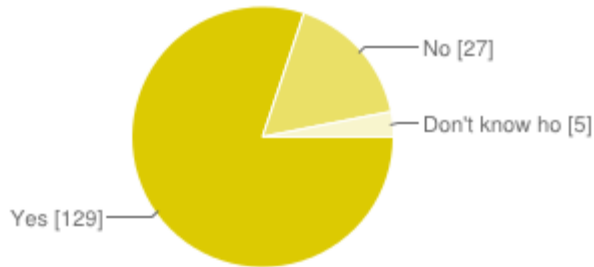

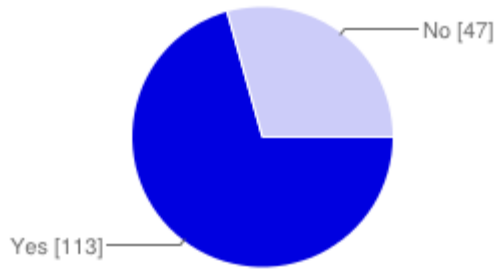

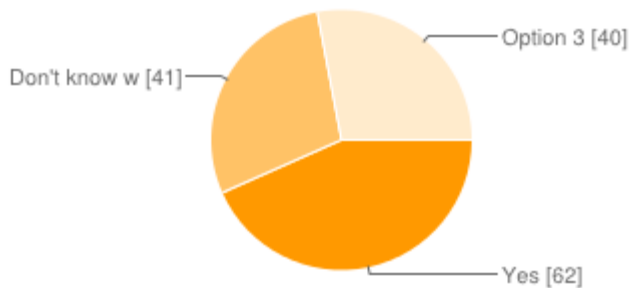

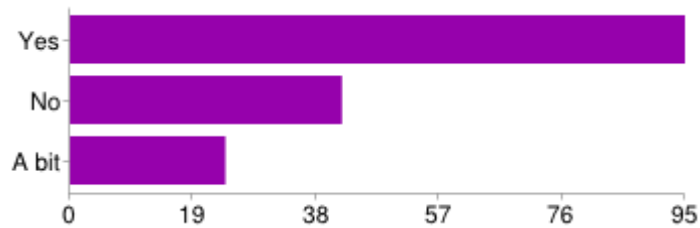

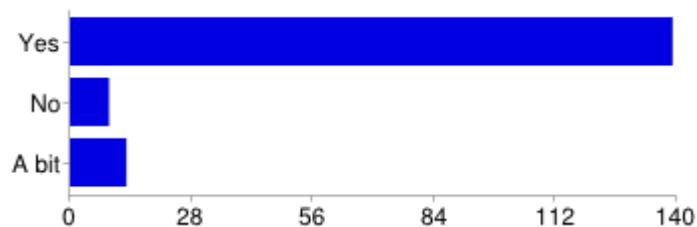

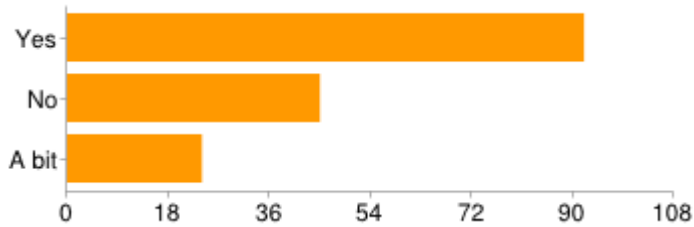

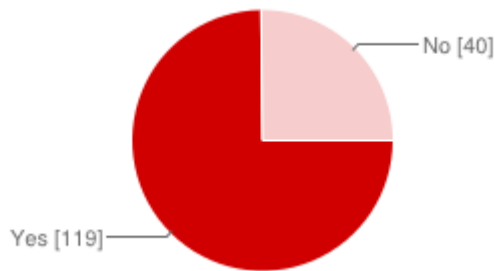

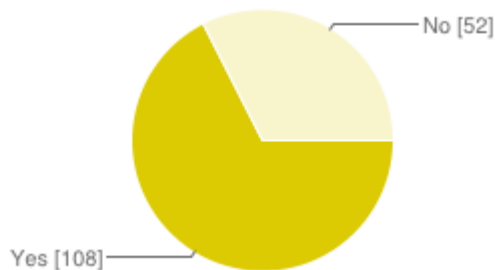
