


# **Product Design Guest Speaker**

# **Keele University Library**



This is a beautiful collaboration across History, Art and Music for a respectful memorial ceremony.






# **Class of 2019 Awards Evening**

The English Department were so impressed with these poems that they decided to run a competition. They have had some absolutely stunning entries.











# **In Student Support**


Student Support having been doing some amazing activities for our students!
