This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Key Stage 3 Music:

Year 7 = 2x50 minute lessons per week.

Year 8 = 1x50 minute lessons per week.

Year 9 = 1x50 minute lessons per week.

At KS3, the aim is to give students the ability to progress in their musical ability whether they choose GCSE or not. The 2 focuses of KS3 music are:

- Practical Skills – Solo Performance, Group Performance and Composition Tasks. Across the 3 years, all students learn the keyboard and ukulele. Students will also partake in Band work and singing activities. There is a focus on confidence through performing, communication skills, time management and creativity.
- Appraisal Skills – Contextual understanding, Musical features, Key words, Listening skills.
- Technology – Students in KS3 begin to compose on composition software such as BandLab Education, Sibelius & MuseScore.

Key Stage 4 Music:

KS4 are offered Music as an optional subject where they study towards the Edexcel GCSE Qualification.

All students have the option to choose GCSE Music, there are no entry requirements but students are made aware of the performance element beforehand.

Year 10 & 11 = 3x50 minute lessons per week.

At KS4, students focus on the instrument of their choice, often taking instrumental lessons within school or outside of school.

There are currently 66 students studying GCSE Music.

At KS4, The Edexcel GCSE is split into 3 sections:

- Performance Skills – 30% of the course. Students progress in their solo and ensemble ability within performance, working on confidence and developing on their chosen instrument.
- Compositional Skills – 30% of the course. Students learn to compose using music technology and/or live song writing both following a brief and also having the freedom to write creatively without a brief.

- Appraisal Skills – 40% of the course. Contextual understanding, Musical features, Key words, Listening skills.

Key Stage 5 Music:

KS5 are offered Music as an optional subject where they study towards the Edexcel A Level Qualification.

Year 12 & 13 = 6x50 minute lessons per week

At KS5, students focus on the instrument of their choice and are offered free tuition on their first choice of instrument within school.

There are currently 6 students studying A-Level Music.

At KS5, The Edexcel A-Level is split into 3 sections:

- Performance Skills – 30% of the course. Students progress in their solo ability within performance, working on confidence and developing on their chosen instrument. Students work towards a 8-10 minute recital in year 13.
- Compositional Skills – 30% of the course. Students learn to compose using music technology and/or live song writing both following a brief and also having the freedom to write creatively without a brief. Students also learn to arrange a piece of music based or complete a Bach Chorale which they complete in a 6-hour exam during year 13.
- Appraisal Skills – 40% of the course. Contextual understanding, Musical features, Key words, Listening skills.

Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

Extra-curricular and Music Tuition plays a large part in the daily life of the Music Department at Walton High School. Below is a list of information regarding the current extra-curricular and tuition offering.

Music Tuition

- Music tuition is offered to all students across years 7-13.
- Lessons are offered at £280 per year. Students receiving free school meals are offered their lessons at a reduced cost of £100 per academic year. A-Level Music students are given tuition on their first instrument for free.
- Tuition ranges from solo lessons, paired lessons and group lessons. This is dependent on ability and instrument.
- Tuition is taught by visiting teachers from Entrust Music Service.
- Tuition is available on Flute, Oboe, Clarinet, Saxophone, Bassoon, Violin, Viola, Cello, Double Bass, Drum Kit, Guitar, Bass Guitar, Voice, Trumpet, Trombone, Euphonium, Tuba, Piano, Keyboard.
- All students are offered the choice to work towards qualifications from either ABRSM, Rockschoool or Trinity (dependant on instrument), but have the choice as to whether they wish to pursue this route.

Entrust Music Service Extra Curricular

Entrust Music Service provide numerous extra musical groups that students can get involved in outside of school time and these are advertised by the visiting teachers to their pupils as well as posters next to the peripatetic timetables in the department.

In School Extra-curricular

Students have the option to get involved in numerous extra-curricular clubs throughout the year in relation to music and/ or drama.

September – December:

All year:

Students also have the option to practice individually or in small groups using the department practice rooms at breaktime and lunchtime on various days, subject to staff permission. GCSE and sixth form students often utilise these rooms to practice during their free periods or lunchtime to prepare for exams and/ or the coursework element of their course.

Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

Lesson Time

Within KS3-5 lessons, students are encouraged to perform to each other regularly and often perform their practical tasks as the assessment at the end of the topic in front of the rest of the class. Students with SEN and SEMH are offered the chance where necessary to perform separately for their assessment.

Local Events

In recent years, we have been invited by local villages to perform for their local events. In the past few years, small groups of students have performed for events such as The Queen's Jubilee and The King's Coronation alongside local performances in 'Stafford's Gotta Sing'. The local village that invited us to partake in these events often invites the students to regular events.

School Planned Events

Thursday 13th November – Year 11 Awards Evening

- Students volunteer to perform whilst parents and ex students are arriving to receive their GCSE certificates and awards.

Tuesday 2nd December – Christmas Concert

- Year 7-13 students
- All extra-curricular clubs perform alongside smaller group pieces arranged in the run up by students and some solo performances from students in years 7-13
- Tickets are sold to parents via ParentPay – prices of tickets are kept cheap to allow parents to afford to attend no matter their situation

17th & 18th March – Annual Pyramid Choir Concert with feeder schools

- Year 7-13 students
- Choir concert in conjunction with Y3-6 students from the local feeder schools
- Live band made up of Walton students and department staff
- 2 joint rehearsals in the run up with all schools together – 11th February and 17th March

Thursday 2nd July – Woodwind Extravaganza

- Year 7-13 students
- Workshop and concert including all woodwind players from Walton and local feeder schools
- Supported by Entrust Music Service staff

8th & 9th July – School Production

- Year 7-13 students
- Auditions and Rehearsals from January until June at lunchtime and weekly full cast after school rehearsals
- Prepared in conjunction with the Drama Department
- Live Band made up of Walton students
